Well-developed stallion; built a bit down-hill. Good length of neck and well-muscled. Back is a little weak; loins are good. Well-muscled croup. Good stance of forelegs and hindlegs. This stallion's athleticism, canter, and jumping traits were assessed via archived video due to an injury that resulted in a pin having to be inserted in his shoulder. One foot is now mis-shaped as a result of the injury, which prevented full weight from being placed on that foot for an extended time period. The stallion competed as a young horse up to 1.30 m. level in FEI and national showjumping until the injury ended his career.

Two members of the WSI Stallion Committee evaluated 15 progeny of Jorado. The progeny are based at eight locations in Kilkenny, Limerick, Tipperary, and Wexford. They ranged in age from a 2-month-old foal to 6-year-old sport horse. The inspectors also reviewed video of progeny showjumping.

The inspectors saw a uniform collection of well-developed, powerfully-built horses. All except two were a little square in their build. All had long legs, and for several the limbs were dry. Several of the horses have hind legs that are a little sickle-shaped, and a couple had front or hind feet that are turned out. Almost all have necks that are a little short. All except one have normal feet, and for the one with different feet the deviation is relatively minor. All have attractive heads and are a type that is pleasing. It is important to note that the inspectors were not able to assess the dam of 14 of the 15 progeny, so care should be taken not to assign full responsibility for all positive and negative traits of progeny to the sire alone.

Multiple riders and owners reported that Jorado makes commercial progeny with good movement, consistently very high trainability, and good interior qualities.

The inspectors believe to best suit Jorado the mare should not have too deep a body or short legs. A mare with a modern warmblood pedigree and phenotype may suit Jorado best, although even when paired with older-fashioned pedigrees and types Jorado produces attractive and correct progeny. The inspectors believe that Jorado will make a good contribution to Irish breeding.

After consideration of the progeny assessment, the stallion's Stage 1 inspection and Stage 2 veterinary examination, and video of the stallion and progeny competing in showjumping, the Stallion Committee has designated Jorado a WSI Approved Stallion.
